



## Spring Vaccination and Coggin's Pricing, 2019

### Services and Testing:

### Vaccine explanations:

Rabies and EWT/WNV are considered core annual vaccines for horses in Vermont. If your horse travels to areas with year-round mosquito populations that are active, you may want to booster the EEE and WEE fraction of this vaccine at 6 months.

Flu and Rhino is considered a core vaccine for horses who come into contact with other horses at shows or group rides, or who live in barns with horse traffic in and out. Initial dose is 2 injections over 30 days, then 1-2 x annually pending exposure.

Strangles is carried by about 5% of the "healthy" horse population and horses who carry the Strangles bacteria are more likely to shed during times of stress, like shows. This disease is highly contagious so if you don't vaccinate, practice excellent biosecurity. Initial series 2 doses over 30 days then 1-2 x annually pending exposure.

Potomac Horse Fever is found in the Champlain Valley and is moving further East every year. It is spread by mayflies and snails found in streams and wetlands. Exposure to other horses is not a mode of transmission. Your horse needs this vaccine based on where he lives/travels. Initial series 2 injections, then annually.

Lyme is variable in location but found in pockets all over Vermont, less in the NEK. The initial series is 3 injections over 6 months and then the vaccine is 1-2 x annually pending exposure.
